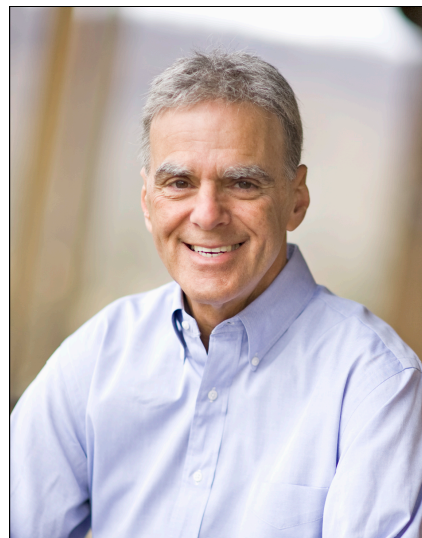


Business Leader • Veteran • Family Man

Bob Roggio is a business leader, former army reservist, and dedicated family man who is running for Congress in Pennsylvania's 6th District. Over the course of a 30-year career, Bob helped to grow a company that created over 600 new jobs, while simultaneously providing affordable healthcare and vocational training for his employees.

After retiring in 1999, Bob went back to school to complete his college education. He graduated from Penn State University in 2003 with high distinction. He then served on the campaign staffs of John Kerry and Bob Casey. Most recently, he served as Senator Casey's Southeastern Pennsylvania Field Representative, where he worked directly with constituents to tackle the difficult issues facing the region.

Bob has always played an active role in his community. He was such a fixture in the Berwyn-Paoli Little League, both as a coach and as the league president, that the league named one of its fields after him. Bob was the founder of the Great Valley Citizens Forum, a nonpartisan organization committed to fact-based, balanced exploration of complex local and national issues. He has also served on the Charlestown Open Space Commission, the Charlestown Parks & Recreation Board, and as Vice-President of the Charlestown Civic Association. In 2005, Bob volunteered for the Red Cross in Florida, providing aid in the aftermath of Hurricane Rita. He is still an active Red Cross volunteer in Chester County.
